## GENERAL CHALLENGE

## **REAL-TIME VIDEO SURVEILLANCE FROM** LOW EARTH ORBIT



How can real-time video capabilities from space be leveraged for military operations (while balancing innovation, geopolitical issues, financial and regulatory considerations, etc.)?

Real-time video surveillance from low Earth orbit (LEO) raises specific legal, regulatory, and partnership issues. Legally, this activity is governed by the 1967 Outer Space Treaty, which prohibits national appropriation of celestial bodies but does not explicitly regulate video surveillance. The Geneva Conventions and international humanitarian law may apply in the event of military use of these technologies.

Regulatory-wise, states must comply with launch licenses and space safety standards (such as those of UNOOSA or the European Commission), in particular to avoid interference or collision risks. Public-private partnerships are essential, such as those between space agencies (ESA, NASA) and private companies (SpaceX, OneWeb), to develop and deploy these surveillance systems. Issues of data sovereignty and cybersecurity are crucial, with risks of conflicts of interest between states and private actors.

Finally, transparency and international cooperation are necessary to avoid misunderstandings and ensure space stability, particularly by sharing video surveillance data to prevent incidents.
